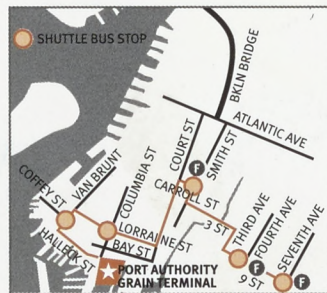
TRAVEL DIRECTIONS

\$10 BUS to/from Manhattan
Call 212.625.3505 to reserve

FREE SHUTTLE BUS in Brooklyn from F train stops (7th Ave, 4th Ave, Carroll St) and Red Hook (Columbia/Lorraine, Van Brunt/Coffey) to/from performance every 1/2 hour starting at 7:45 p.m. Makes stops at Red Hook watering holes following performance.

BY CAR: stay in center lane off Brooklyn Bridge to "T" at Atlantic Ave, right onto Atlantic, left onto Court St, straight across Hamilton Ave. (6 lane street), right onto Bay St., left onto Columbia St., bear left at fork. Entrance on left after baseball field.
