JOANNA HAIGOOD, choreographer, has been Artistic Director of Zaccho Dance Theatre since 1980. Her work has been commissioned by many arts institutions, including Dancing in the Streets, Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, Walker Arts Center, the Exploratorium Museum, the National Black Arts Festival, Festival d'Avignon as well as Alonzo King's Lines Ballet and Joffrey Ballet of Chicago. Joanna has also had the privilege to mentor many extraordinary young artists internationally at the National École des Arts du Cirque in France, the Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance in England, Spelman College, the Institute for Diversity in the Arts at Stanford University. San Francisco Circus Center and at Zaccho Studio.

VERONICA BLAIR, performer, has emerged as one of the top Black aerialists in the country, and has taken her high-flying talents all around the world. A Bay Area native. Blair began her career at the age of 14 at the former San Francisco School of Circus Arts, now known as the Circus Center San Francisco. Shortly after making her debut at 17. she was noticed by Cedric Walker, the founder of the Universoul Circus. Walker named Blair as a solo trapeze artist, and she was Universoul's Resident Aerialist for over five years. Blair has performed in "Afrika! Afrika!," Germany's largest circus event, and also worked for Universal Studios Japan. She still works with the Circus Center, and has put on shows featuring other Black aerialists and circus performers for themed events, such as a tribute to recording artist Prince that took place in 2014. Black circus performers are rarely recognized, and Blair has taken on the task of filming a documentary that puts a new light on those who work in the industry. Blair's The Uncle Junior Project came about after the death of little-known Black circus animal trainer of the same name. In an attempt to uphold Junior's legacy and that of the Black circus, Blair has the ambitious aim of bringing those unknown entertainers to the forefront.

CORPOREAL IMAGO

GABRIELLE MARTIN is a choreographer working in contemporary dance and circus. She began performing street circus arts with companies such as the Public Dreams Society in 2001, and directing and independently producing multidisciplinary performance projects in 2003. Gabrielle has a BFA in Contemporary Dance from Concordia University (Montreal, 2009) and a certificate in Dramaturgy from the Centre national des

arts du cirque (Châlons-en-champagne,



2020). From 2009-2011, she presented her choreography at the Vancouver International Dance Festival, Guelph Contemporary Dance Festival, ROMP! A Festival of Independent Dance (Victoria), WAVE RISING SERIES (New York), and more. Gabrielle performed in over 1,400 shows as an aerialist and dancer with Cavalia (2011-2015), and as a principal character and aerial soloist with Cirque du Soleil (2015-2019). Since 2018, Gabrielle has been choreographing and producing under Corporeal Imago.

JEREMIAH HUGHES is a dynamic physical performer who places great importance on storytelling in his craft. He trained and competed extensively with the Canadian Dance Company (Toronto) before studying at the Randolph College for the Performing Arts (Toronto). He was a featured soloist on So You Think You Can Dance (2007) and So You Think You Can Dance Canada (2008), and joined the competitive internship program at the Broadway Dance Center (NYC) in 2008. Jeremiah has performed with artists such as Bruno Mars, Meatloaf, and Taylor Swift, and in large-scale shows such as: PEEPSHOW, JUBILEE!, Britain's Got Talent, Franco Dragone's LE REVE and Cirque du Soleil's Viva ELVIS. From 2015-2019, he toured as dance captain and the lead male character of Ralu in Cirque Du Soleil's TORUK - The First Flight. Jeremiah is Co-Artistic Director of Corporeal Imago. as well as a practicing actor working in film and television.

EOWYNN ENOUIST (She/Her) is a free-lance artist and multidisciplinary performer. Eowynn's artistic practice includes; contemporary dance, theater, aerial rope, tv, film, and creative writing. Eowynn is thrilled to be currently working with Corporeal Imago as an aerial dance performer in Limb(e)s. Eowvnn has worked with established dance companies and independent choreographers in Canada such as: Action at a Distance. Anne Plamondon Productions (Montréal,QB), Anya Saugstad, Cristina Bucci, Daria Mikhaylyuk, Heather Myers, Isak Enquist, Kinesis Dance Somatheatro, Mahaila Paterson-O'Brien, Mascall Dance, Nicole Von Arc for Edmonton Opera's production of Orphee+, Out Innerspace Dance Theatre, Rachel Meyer, Vision Impure Compagnie,

and Wen Wei Dance.

ISAK ENOUIST is a movement artist. choreographer, and experimental musician/sound designer living on Səlílwəta?/ Selilwitulh, Skwxwú7mesh, and xwməθkwəyəm nations (Vancouver, BC). Raised in the Kootenays/Ktunaxa of Canada, he began formal training in Shotokan Karate-Do before pursuing post- secondary dance education at Simon Fraser University and Modus Operandi (Vancouver), as well as training intensives with The Ailey School (Italy/New York) and Springboard Danse Montréal. He has performed nationally and internationally with Canadian performing companies such as: Out Innerspace Dance Theatre. Compagnie Vision Impure, Shay Kuebler Radical System Art, Mahaila Patterson-O'Brien, Amber Funk Barton (the response.), Mascall Dance, CAMP, Generous Mess, Anne Plamondon Productions, and Corporeal Imago. Isak is also a choreographer and producer with Enquist X Enquist on various projects. He is honoured to be performing Corporeal Imago's "Limb(e)s" this upcoming season.

CORPOREAL IMAGO (CI) explores contemporary tragedy through an intersection of aerial acrobatics, contemporary dance and visual theatre. Speaking to the disenchantment of our times, the company's work bridges the apotheosis of circus, and its metaphor for surpassing our human limitations, with the cathartic

potential of dance. Brought together by their shared background in dance and theatre, choreographers Gabrielle Martin and Jeremiah Hughes co-founded CI while performing as principal characters with Cirque du Soleil's TORUK in 2018. For two artists used to performing circus as entertainment. CI has become a carte blanche to explore the shadow side of our human experience. Since founding the company in 2018, their work has been presented across Canada and internationally, was nominated for a TOTAL THEATRE AWARD in Physical and Visual Theatre (UK, 2019), and won The Dance Centre's Isadora Award for excellence in choreography (Vancouver, 2022).

COLIN ZACHARIAS is an IFMGA/ACMG Mountain Guide, Mountain Safety Consultant, Technical Director, Rigger, Lecturer, Instructor and Technical Writer. He assesses and develops risk management plans for the ski industry and consults as an expert witness for insurance companies, law firms and professional associations. Colin has been the Aeriosa Safety Director and Rigging Designer since 2008. He is the author of Aeriosa's Health and Safety Manual and he provides safety training for Aeriosa company dancers and riggers. He supports

Aeriosa dance artists and technicians by producing venue-specific safety plans, managing the rigging equipment inventory, designing rigging systems and onsite supervision.

MEGHAN GOODMAN



ALYSSA VIRAY began her training at Westlake School for the Performing Arts. She received her BFA in Dance from the Alonzo King LINES Ballet Program at Dominican University of California. During her time in the LINES BFA Program, she performed works by Gregory Dawson, Dexandro Montalvo, Kara Davis, Liv Schaffer, and Jav Carlon. She furthered her training at different intensives such as Orsolina'28 Nunes/Flock Intensive, BalletX Winter Intensive, and Modus Operandi Summer Intensive. She started dancing with dawsondancesf in 2022. She was part of the world premiere of "The Joy Protocol" in collaboration with Richard Howell and performed in "The Middle Period" for the Tannery Winter Dance Festival and Black Choreographer's Festival.

VERONICA BLAIR has emerged as one of the top Black aerialists in the country, and has taken her high-flying talents all around the world. A Bay Area native, Blair began her career at the age of 14 at the former San Francisco School of Circus Arts, now known as the Circus Center San Francisco. Shortly after making her debut at 17, she was noticed by Cedric Walker, the founder of the Universoul Circus. Walker named Blair as a solo trapeze artist, and she was Universoul's Resident Aerialist for over five years. Blair has performed in "Afrika! Afrika!," Germany's largest circus event, and also worked for Universal Studios Japan. She still works with the Circus Center, and has put on shows featuring other Black aerialists and circus performers for themed events, such as a tribute to recording artist Prince that took place in 2014. Black circus performers are rarely recognized, and Blair has taken on the task of filming a documentary that puts a new light on those who work in the industry. Blair's The Uncle Junior Project came about after the death of little-known Black circus animal trainer of the same name. In an attempt to uphold Junior's legacy and that of the Black circus, Blair has the ambitious aim of bringing those unknown entertainers to the forefront.

GREGORY DAWSON At its core, Gregory Dawson's creative philosophy is rooted in the notions of cultural and human respect that aims to move beyond social biases and divisions that may otherwise prevent individuals from expressing who they truly are. Working from truths allows us to be open and giving with our works.

The wispy quality of professional ballerinas sets a precedent for aspiring dancers that is often unachievable through healthy practices. As a result, young dancers are typically tempted to change their bodies by overexercising or under-eating. According to a study in 2019, dancers are three times more likely to develop an eating disorder than non-dancers. In my interviews with current and former ballet dancers. I found their stories of body shame and eating disorders echoed my own. We pushed ourselves through 8 hours of dance with nothing but a granola bar in our stomachs. We hated wearing a leotard and tights in front of a mirror all day. We all had these experiences and still, many of my interview questions were met with the phrase, "I've never told

anyone this but..." To start conversations about body shame in the performing arts, I am creating a collaborative video project using aerial dance and original music to express how ballet shaped my body image. This piece will demonstrate the restriction of body shame and the freedom of relinquishing that shame.
